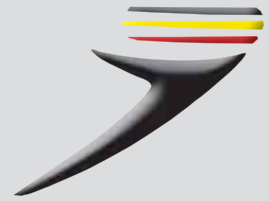

ASHE's vision is that indigenous students are given the opportunity to participate in a broad range of education and training within a trusted, culturally appropriate setting. Students are given the opportunity for to participate in nationally accredited Certificate Level courses plus a range of short courses at ASHE's main campus which is located in Shepparton, Victoria.



Enrolments at the Academy of Sport, Health and Education are taken until the end of January each year, in time for the start of classes in February. However, ASHE is happy to talk to anyone considering becoming a student at any time of the year.

Full-time programs are offered five days per week for all students at ASHE. Students are required to attend ASHE each day in order to complete their study commitments and to give themselves the best possible chance of achieving their individual learning plans.
